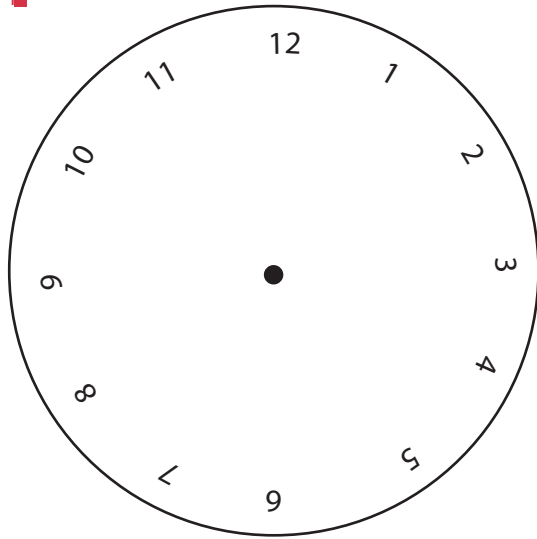

Go to the 'History of Train Safeworking' cell. Find the the clock in the 'Centralised Traffic Control' display.

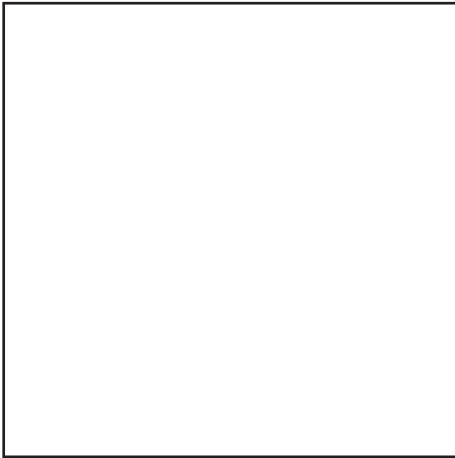
What time is shown on the clock.
